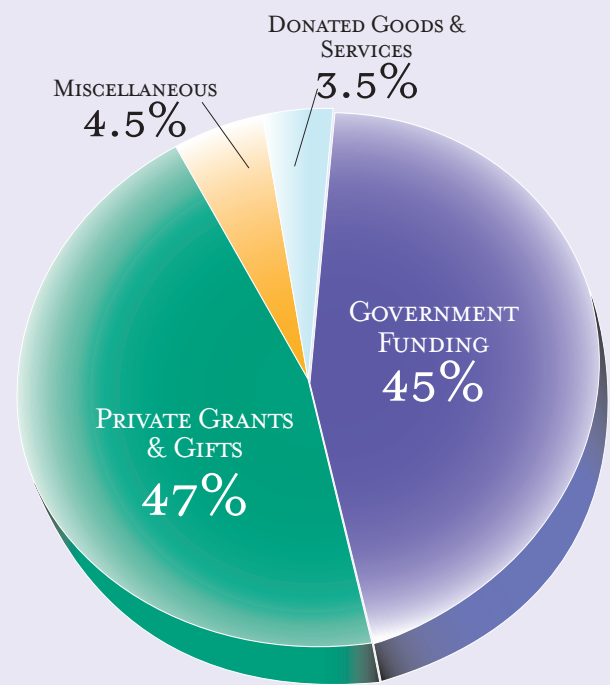

2007 HIGHLIGHTS

Family Child Care Business Enterprise forms a partnership with Cambridge College: credit-bearing early education courses are taught on site.

Employer Partnerships contracts with Partners HealthCare overall, and Brigham & Women's additionally, to prepare low-income community members for entry level jobs with career ladders in the health care field.

Twelve Project Hope scholars in the One Family program complete their higher education studies.

Project Hope is chosen to participate in Housing First, a homelessness prevention initiative. Agencies, landlords, and management companies work together to stop the downward spiral into homelessness.

Project Hope's main office building at 550 Dudley Street, the first environmentally friendly building in Roxbury, applies for silver status for showing Leadership in Energy and Environmental Design.

The Family Shelter undergoes a sparkling MakeOver, sponsored by WCVB-TV: it continues to air public service announcements about our mission. Shelter capacity is enlarged to house 11 families.

Groundwork is laid for Family Works, an intensive case management model.

Software is designed to gather Efforts to Outcomes data from Project Hope programs.
