New Program PREPs People for Jobs

The **Professional Readiness & Employment Program (PREP)** kicked off this summer as the third training track offered by Project Hope's Employer Partnerships. PREP is a practical workshop series designed to enhance and improve career development skills.

The workshops are designed to help participants develop a professional profile, boost confidence, and improve job-readiness skills. Skills range from interviewing techniques to writing a resume to understanding workplace expectations.

PREP will build on Employer Partnerships' 7-year history of collaboration with Boston's largest hospitals to train and place community members into jobs that pay a living wage.

This program will set our participants apart from other applicants and help them compete in today's increasingly challenging job market. The PREP program was made possible by seed funding from **The Florence V. Burden Foundation**. ❖
